Garda Vetting to Commence in October 2015

The Irish Government is introducing Garda vetting for all those who work with children or vulnerable adults. This is in accordance with the National Vetting Bureau (Children and Vulnerable Persons) Act 2012. IACP is required to facilitate mandatory Garda Vetting for IACP student, pre-accredited and accredited members.

Membership of the IACP will be dependent on individuals obtaining Garda Vetting (via IACP) which will ensure compliance with this new law once it is commenced.

The IACP will commence vetting in **October 2015** and it will have a phased introduction. First to be vetted will be all IACP staff, the Executive Committee members, Regional Committee members and Sub-Committee members. Once the personnel mentioned above have been vetted, IACP student members, pre-accredited members and accredited members will be contacted by IACP and vetted.

Please Note: No action is required by IACP members at this time. IACP will contact members over the coming months.
