Conference on Domestic Abuse in LGBT Relationships – Dundalk Outcomers

Dundalk Outcomers invites you to the first ever conference in Ireland on Domestic Abuse in LGBT Relationships.

Dundalk Outcomers are hosting Ireland's first conference on Domestic Abuse in lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) relationships. The conference is being held with the support of the Health Service Executive North East and in collaboration with some of Ireland's key domestic abuse support services.

The conference will explore the issues of violence and abuse within LGBT relationships and provide a forum for domestic abuse support services and LGBT groups to explore joint strategies to support both victims and perpetrators of Domestic Abuse and the legal protection afforded them.

The conference will include the launch of Dundalk Outcomers new Domestic Abuse information campaign 'Are You?' which is supported by Cosc, the National Office for the prevention of Domestic, Sexual and Gender-based Violence?

Discussions will take place between directors of national and local Domestic Abuse support services, LGBT groups and Irish researchers currently working on this issue. Participating organisations include LGBT groups, Cosc, SAFE Ireland, Rape Crisis Network Ireland, HSE Child and Family Agency, AMEN, MOVE, Dundalk Women's Aid and Dundalk Rape Crisis, and the Scotland based organisation Voluntary Action Fund, Violence Against Women Team.

Volunteer Intern Psychotherapist Position – CARI Limerick

CARI provides therapy for children and young people who have been affected by child sexual abuse. CARI also provides information, support and counselling to non-abusing parents, carers and siblings as appropriate.

CARI believes that children have the right to a service that respects their freedom of expression and their right to child-centred services. We respect the strength and resilience of children and design our services to build on this strength, enabling children to grow into adulthood defined not by their abusive experiences but by their individuality and creativity.

CARI is currently seeking applications from volunteer Psychotherapists for internship placements in their Limerick centre. Internship therapist positions will be offered to individuals who have successfully completed a recognised training course (by IACP, IAHP or PSI) in Psychotherapy or Counselling Psychology.

CARI Psychotherapy Model is a specific model which is child centred, placing the child as the primary client. We also provide parallel support sessions for parents/carers to enable them to support their child’s emotional needs.

These positions will offer Psychotherapists the opportunity to work as part of a dynamic team.

These positions are offered on an unpaid basis. Training on the CARI model and ongoing supervision will be provided.

Garda vetting will be required.
